GOVERNOR-DECLARED DISASTER

PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

If your property was impacted by the Governor-declared disaster, you may be eligible for 2026 property tax relief.



WHO MAY QUALIFY:

SEC. 11.35 - TEMPORARY EXEMPTION FOR QUALIFIED PROPERTY INCLUDED IN THE GOVERNOR DECLARED DISASTER AREA AND IS AT LEAST 15% DAMAGED BY THE DISASTER



ELIGIBLE PROPERTY:

- Improvements to real property (Texas Tax Code §1.045)
- Tangible personal property used for the production of income
- Certain manufactured homes.

APPLICATION DEADLINE :

NOVEMBER 16, 2026

Applications must be filed with the Jack County Appraisal District by the statutory deadline



WHAT WILL YOU NEED:

1. Texas Comptroller Form 50-312
2. Information describing the damage sustained
3. Photographs of the damage, if available
4. Insurance documentation, repair estimates, or other supporting documentation
5. Any additional information requested by the Jack County Appraisal District



IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

The temporary disaster exemption is not automatic. A property owner must file the required application with the appraisal district within the statutory filing period

The Chief Appraiser will review the application and determine whether the property qualifies and the appropriate damage assessment level. The amount of the temporary exemption is based on the extent of the qualifying damage and the applicable provisions of Texas Tax Code Section 11.3
